
In order to support Gifu Prefecture's growth as a multicultural region, the prefecture has been continuing its cultural exchange with many countries and regions around the world.

This year's Gifu: Land of Clear Waters" Cultural Festival marks the 39th National Culture Festival and the 24th National Disabled Persons Arts and Culture Festival. At this festival, which opened on October 14th, Gifu Prefecture welcomed the participation of many countries, including Poland (Silesia region), Lithuania, and China (Jiangxi). This event encouraged a lot of conversation.

# Silesia region, Poland

Cultural exchange between Gifu Prefecture and Poland began at the Tokyo Olympics in 2021, when Poland's canoe team lodged in Ena



city before the competition. In 2023, the two regions signed a memorandum as a symbol for future friendly relations and exchange. Currently, Gifu Prefecture and Poland are continuing exchanges in the fields of economics, tourism, sports, and art.

In the Gifu: Land of Clear Waters" Cultural Festival 2024, the Śląsk Song and Dance Ensemble from Poland visited Ena city and Gifu city, and performed in the opening ceremony.

#### Lithuania

Gifu Prefecture and Lithuania are connected by the vice-consul and Gifu native Chiune Sugihara, who is known for issuing Visas for Life for thousands of Jewish refugees in World War II. Honoring this connection today, Gifu and Lithuania are continuing their cultural exchange in a variety of areas.

This year, at the 7th annual 'Lithuania NOW' cultural introduction event, the Nemunas Folk Dance Ensemble of Kaunas University of Technology held

performances in Gifu city and Yaotsu town and performed in the National Culture Festival's 'Here and Abroad Great Cultural Exchange Program'.

Together with a special performance by the students of Yaotsu Elementary School, the ensemble joined in a choral rendition of the cultural festival's theme song.





Exchanges between Gifu and Jiangxi began in 1980, when the Gifu Prefectural Assembly Members Association for Japan-China Friendship visited Jiangxi. Commencing from the 1988 signing of the Friendly Partnership Contract, an extensive cultural exchange has been occurring not just on the prefectural level, but also on the level of cities, towns, and individual groups. In 2023, the 35th anniversary of the Friendly Partnership Contract was celebrated.


At the National Cultural Festival, a Jianxi art group gave a performance of puppet theatre.


At the Gifu International Center and the Gifu Prefectural Office Tourism and International Policy Division, four new members step into the role as CIRs.



# Change in the Number of Foreign Residents in Gifu Prefecture and Japan



Due to the amendment to the Immigration Control and Refugee Recognition Act in 1989 (implemented in 1990), the descendants of Japanese nationals (including married partners up until the 3rd generation) were granted status of residence without a working permit. Furthermore, due to the foreign technical intern training program, the number of foreign nationals living in Japan continued to increase. The 2008 global financial crisis and the 2020-2021 Covid 19 pandemic caused a slight downturn of the foreign resident population, but the recent economic recovery and plans for opening the border to foreigners brought on another increase. At the end of 2023, the foreign resident population reached a record peak of 3,410,000.

Concurrently, in Gifu Prefecture at the end of 2023, there was also a record peak of 69,477 foreign residents. Looking forward, it is estimated that with the rise in job openings, the acceptance of foreign individuals, and an increase in exchange student hirings, this increase is likely to continue for some time.

# The Gifu Prefecture Multicultural Co-Existence Policy Promotion

Gifu Prefecture recognizes the local international community as being made up of 'foreign prefectural citizens'. Through the encouragement of respect for cultural values and the facilitation of communication between all prefectural citizens, the Multicultural Co-Existence Policy aims to create a community in which all members can live and work in peace and harmony.
